House Bill 540 (AS PASSED HOUSE AND SENATE)

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To create a board of elections and registration for Wilkes County; to provide for its powers 2 and duties; to provide for definitions; to provide for the composition of the board and the 3 appointment and certification of members; to provide for the qualifications, terms, and 4 removal of members; to provide for vacancies; to provide for oaths and privileges; to provide 5 for the conduct of primaries and elections; to provide for action, meetings, and records; to authorize the conduct of municipal elections; to authorize expenditure of public funds for an 6 7 elections supervisor and clerical assistants; to provide compensation for board members and 8 staff; to provide for offices, supplies, and other materials; to provide for the transfer of 9 powers, duties, facilities, and personal property; to allow for joint primaries; to abolish the 10 Board of Registrars of Wilkes County; to provide for related matters; to provide effective 11 dates; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

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- 14 Pursuant to subsection (b) of Code Section 21-2-40 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 15 Annotated, there is created the Board of Elections and Registration of Wilkes County. The
- 16 Board of Elections and Registration of Wilkes County shall have the powers, duties, and

17 responsibilities of the superintendent of elections of Wilkes County under Chapter 2 of

- 18 Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, the "Georgia Election Code," as the same
- 19 now exists or may hereafter be amended, which powers, duties, and responsibilities are
- 20 currently being exercised by the judge of the Probate Court of Wilkes County, and the
- 21 powers, duties, and responsibilities of the Board of Registrars of Wilkes County under
- 22 Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, the "Georgia Election
- 23 Code," as the same now exists or may hereafter be amended.
- SECTION 2.
- 25 As used in this Act, the term:
- 26 (1) "Board" means the Wilkes County Board of Elections and Registration.
- 27 (2) "Commissioners" means the Board of Commissioners of Wilkes County.
- 28 (3) "County" means Wilkes County.
- 29 (4) "Election," "primary," and "public office" shall have the same meanings as ascribed
- 30 to those terms by Code Section 21-2-2 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, unless
- 31 otherwise clearly apparent from the text of this Act.
- 32 SECTION 3.
- 33 (a) The board shall be composed of a chairperson and four members who shall be appointed
- 34 as provided in this section.
- 35 (b) Four members of the board shall be appointed by the commissioners and one member
- 36 shall be appointed by the chairperson of the commissioners, which member shall serve as
- 37 chairperson of the board during his or her term of office.
- 38 (c)(1) The initial members of the board shall be appointed no later than June 1, 2023.
- The initial members shall take office on July 1, 2023.
- 40 (2) Two of the initial members shall serve two-year terms and three of the initial
- 41 members, including the chairperson, shall serve four-year terms. Successors to members

serving two-year initial terms shall be appointed not later than 30 days prior to the expiration of such member's two-year term of office, to take office on July 1, 2025, and such members shall serve four-year terms thereafter and until their respective successors are appointed and qualified. Successors to all members shall be appointed not later than 30 days prior to the expiration of such member's term.

(3) Successors to the initial members shall be appointed and certified in the same manner as the initial members of the board.

49 SECTION 4.

50 (a) No person who holds elective public office shall be eligible to serve as a member of the

51 board during the term of such elective public office, and the position of any member of the

52 board shall be deemed vacant upon such member's qualifying as a candidate for elective

53 public office.

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54 (b) Members of the board shall be residents of Wilkes County and shall have been registered

voters in Wilkes County for a period of at least one year prior to the date of their appointment

56 to the board.

57 SECTION 5.

The governing authority of Wilkes County shall certify the appointment of each member of the board by filing an affidavit with the clerk of the superior court not later than 15 days preceding the date upon which each member is to take office, stating the name and residential address of the person appointed and certifying that such member has been duly appointed as provided in this Act. The clerk of the superior court shall record each of such certifications on the minutes of the superior court and shall certify the name of each such appointed member to the Secretary of State and provide for the issuance of appropriate commissions to the members within the same time and in the same manner as provided by law for registrars.

67 SECTION 6.

Each member of the board shall have the right to resign at any time by giving written notice of such resignation to the governing authority of Wilkes County and to the clerk of the superior court and shall be subject to removal from the board by the governing authority of

71 Wilkes County at any time, for cause, after notice and hearing.

72 SECTION 7.

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In the event a vacancy occurs in the office of any appointed member or the chairperson before the expiration of his or her term, by removal, death, resignation, or otherwise, the commissioners or the chairperson of the commissioners, as appropriate, shall appoint a successor to serve the remainder of the unexpired term as provided for in Section 3 of this Act. The clerk of the superior court shall be notified of such interim appointments and record and certify such appointments in the same manner as the regular appointments of members.

SECTION 8.

81 Before entering upon the member's duties, each member shall take substantially the same oath as required by law for registrars and shall have the same privileges from arrest.

SECTION 9.

(a) The board shall be authorized to organize itself, determine its procedural rules and regulations, adopt bylaws, specify the functions and duties of its employees, and otherwise take such action as is appropriate to the management of the affairs committed to its supervision; provided, however, that no such action shall conflict with state law. Action and decision by the board shall be by a majority of the members of the board. The board shall be responsible for the selection and appointment of poll workers in primaries and elections.

90 (b) The board shall fix and establish, by appropriate resolution entered on its minutes,

- 91 directives governing the execution of matters within its jurisdiction. Any specially called
- meeting shall be called by the chairperson or any two members of the board. The board shall
- 93 maintain a written record of policy decisions amended to include additions or deletions.

94 Such written records shall be made available for the public to review.

95 **SECTION 10.**

96 The Board of Commissioners shall have the authority to contract with any municipality

97 located within Wilkes County for the holding by the board of any primary or election to be

98 conducted within such municipality.

99 **SECTION 11.**

- 100 (a) The governing authority of Wilkes County shall be authorized to allocate funds for, and
- the county administrator of Wilkes County shall be authorized to appoint, an elections
- supervisor to generally supervise, direct, and control the administration of the affairs of the
- board pursuant to law and duly adopted resolution of the board. The elections supervisor
- shall not be a member of the board or any elected official. The elections supervisor shall be
- 105 considered an employee of Wilkes County and shall be entitled to the same benefits as other
- 106 employees of Wilkes County.
- 107 (b) The governing authority of Wilkes County shall be authorized to allocate funds for, and
- the elections supervisor shall be authorized to employ, additional clerical assistants as needed
- to carry out the duties and functions of the board, with the advice and consent of the Board
- 110 of Elections and Registration. All such clerical assistants shall be considered to be
- employees of Wilkes County and shall be entitled to the same benefits as other employees
- of Wilkes County.

113 **SECTION 12.**

114 Compensation for the members of the board, elections supervisor, clerical assistants, and 115 other employees shall be fixed by the governing authority of Wilkes County. Such 116 compensation shall be paid wholly from county funds.

117 **SECTION 13.**

Nothing in this Act shall be construed to require or prohibit joint primaries or to require or prohibit the commissioners or any other public agency to bear any expense of conducting primaries not otherwise required by law.

121 **SECTION 14.**

The governing authority of Wilkes County shall provide the board with such proper and suitable offices, equipment, materials, and supplies and with such clerical assistance and employees as the governing authority of Wilkes County deems appropriate.

125 **SECTION 15.**

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This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon it becoming law without such approval for the purposes of making initial appointments to the board only. The remainder of the Act shall become effective on July 1, 2023. Upon the entirety of this Act becoming effective, the judge of the Probate Court of Wilkes County and the Board of Registrars of Wilkes County shall be relieved of all powers and duties to which the board succeeds by the provisions of this Act and shall deliver to the board all equipment, supplies, materials, books, papers, records, and facilities pertaining to such powers and duties. On such date, the Board of Registrars of Wilkes County shall be abolished.

134 **SECTION 16.**

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
